At the scheduled time, we will head to Bogotá's historic center to begin a walking tour of Bolívar Square and the surrounding streets. You will see landmarks such as the National Capitol (the hub of the country's legislative life), the Casa de los Comuneros, the Casa de Nariño (seat of the Presidency), and the Santa Clara Church and Museum. You will visit the Gold Museum, home to approximately 34,000 gold artifacts from various pre-Hispanic cultures. The tour continues from the city's base elevation of 2,600 meters above sea level up to the sanctuary at 3,152 meters, where the image of the "Fallen Lord of Monserrate" (*Señor Caído de Monserrate*) is venerated. From this vantage point, you can enjoy the best panoramic view of Bogotá. Overnight stay.

After breakfast, at the scheduled time, we will begin a tour across the Bogotá savanna to the city of Zipaquirá—a name that means "City of our Father" in the Chibcha language. In pre-Columbian times, salt springs in this region were exploited to produce "salt loaves," a form of hard currency used by the Muisca people for trade. Over time, technology evolved, and mining shafts were opened to extract larger quantities of salt. The Zipaquirá Salt Cathedral stands within these ancient underground galleries, 180 meters below the surface. The site features a small miners' chapel dedicated to the Virgin—specifically, Our Lady of the Rosary of Guasá (the word *Guasá* means "mine" in Chibcha). We will return to Bogotá at the end of the visit.
